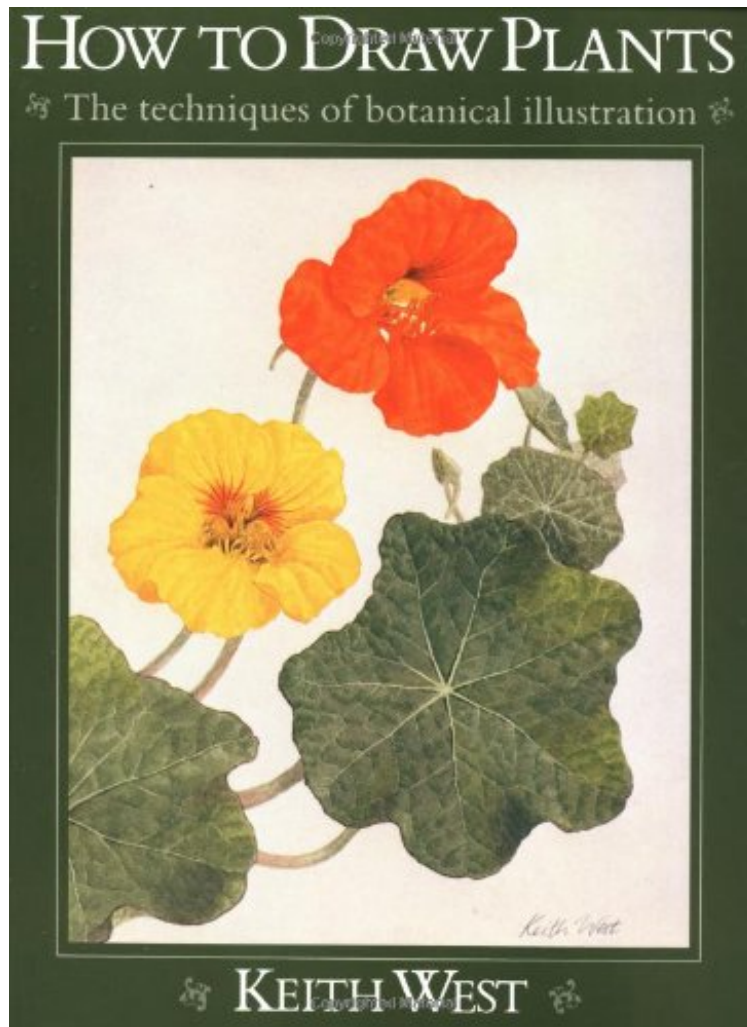

Essential botanical terms and information are fully explained and illustrated, and there is a glossary. Approximately 130 illustrations (10 in colour) include examples of work of well-known artists of the past and a large number of diagrams and line drawings.
