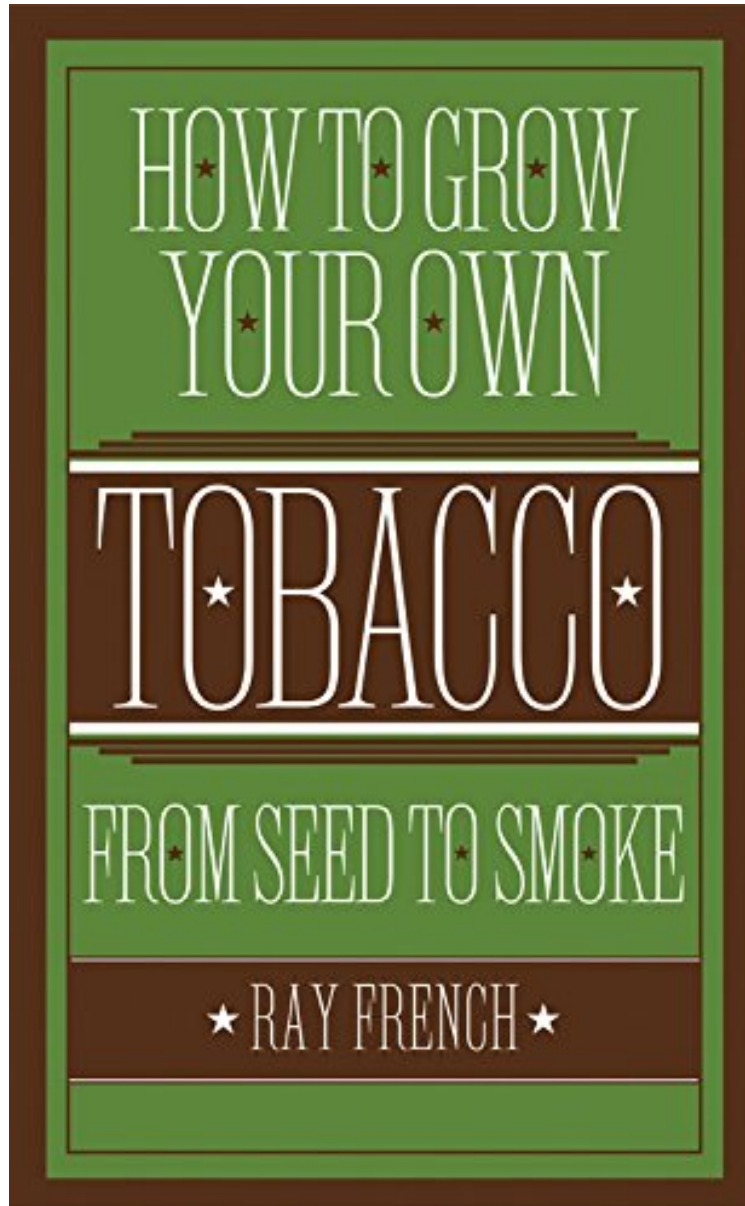

Some of the tips are probably worth the price of the book, like mixing your seeds with sand to help spread them when placing in soil. Also has sections on drying, curing and how to roll cigars.
